
BTV IS BACK!

We hope you enjoy the show!













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
ROOM 24: ON THE CASE!














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
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
EXPLORING MATH THROUGH MOVEMENT




















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A SUCCESSFUL START TO THE SCHOOL YEAR

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
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INTERACTIVE ADVENTURES WITH ROOM 29






















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ROOM 8 AND THE HUNGRY CATERPILLAR

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
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FRUIT PROGRAM IN ROOM 17

LITERACY IN ROOM 5S





Equipment to support mealtimes

Mealtimes are an important part of our everyday life. Not only do they provide us with the energy our bodies need, but they also offer valuable opportunities for social connection with our family or friends.



Various equipment is available to support independence at mealtimes. Here are a few items some of our students use at school:



Non-slip fabric underneath a plate or bowl can support students to scoop food without the plate/bowl moving.



Some students find it helpful to use cutlery with a thick handle which is easier to grasp.



Reflo Smart cups are helpful for some students. These reduce the flow rate of liquid coming out of the cup to limit the volume entering the mouth.

Functional Literacy

Every Friday afternoon, Room 15S engages in different activities which target generalisation of reading and comprehension skills across functional and life skills-based situations.

Some of the activities in which they engaged in were:

Practising writing and reading birthday invitations for a class party.

They used the invitations to work on 'wh-' questions like who, what, when and where.







Making sandwiches with toppings of their choice and then sequenced the procedure using visuals or writing procedural text.







Reading and identifying different community signs, and understanding what the signs mean.
